I certify that the applicant requires use of Talking Books Service as outlined in the Eligibility Criteria.

Eligibility Criteria. The Talking Book Service is for persons unable to read print. The following persons are eligible for this service:

- Blind persons whose visual acuity as determined by competent authority, is 20/200 or less in the better eye correcting glasses, or whose widest diameter of visible field subtends an angular distance no greater than 20 degrees.
- Persons whose **visual disability**, with correction and regardless of optical measurement, is certified by competent authority as preventing the reading of standard print material
- Persons certified by competent authority as unable to read or unable to use standard printed material as a result of **physical limitations**.
- Persons certified by competent authority as having a **reading disability** resulting from organic dysfunction and of sufficient severity to prevent their reading printed material in a normal manner.

The Canadian National Institute For The Blind makes talking books available for use by persons unable to read print due to a visual or physical or learning disability, guaranteeing that these books are for the exclusive use of such persons. I understand that the Canadian National Institute For the Blind has contractual agreements with copyright holders, and with other production sources of special format materials, and is obligated to ensure that each borrower is unable to read print because of impairments as set out in the eligibility criteria.

Talking Book Service Includes:

- Loans of many KPL materials for 6 weeks, including Large Print books, Audiobooks, CD's, and other regular collections of books.
- Access to KPL's magazines and special Express Read or Express View collections at the regular loan periods
- Use of KPL's Daisy Books Collection and Daisy Readers, for 6 week loans.
- All materials are fines exempt

What are Daisy Books?

Daisy is an audiobook format that is supported by the Canadian National Institute for the Blind. Only Talking Book cardholders may borrow from the Daisy Books collection. These books are recorded onto a single disc for convenience. KPL has several Daisy Book Readers for loan. The Daisy collection is kept at the Main Library, however you may choose to pick your materials up at any KPL branch.
