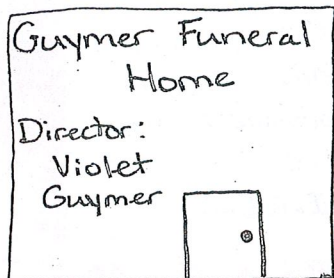
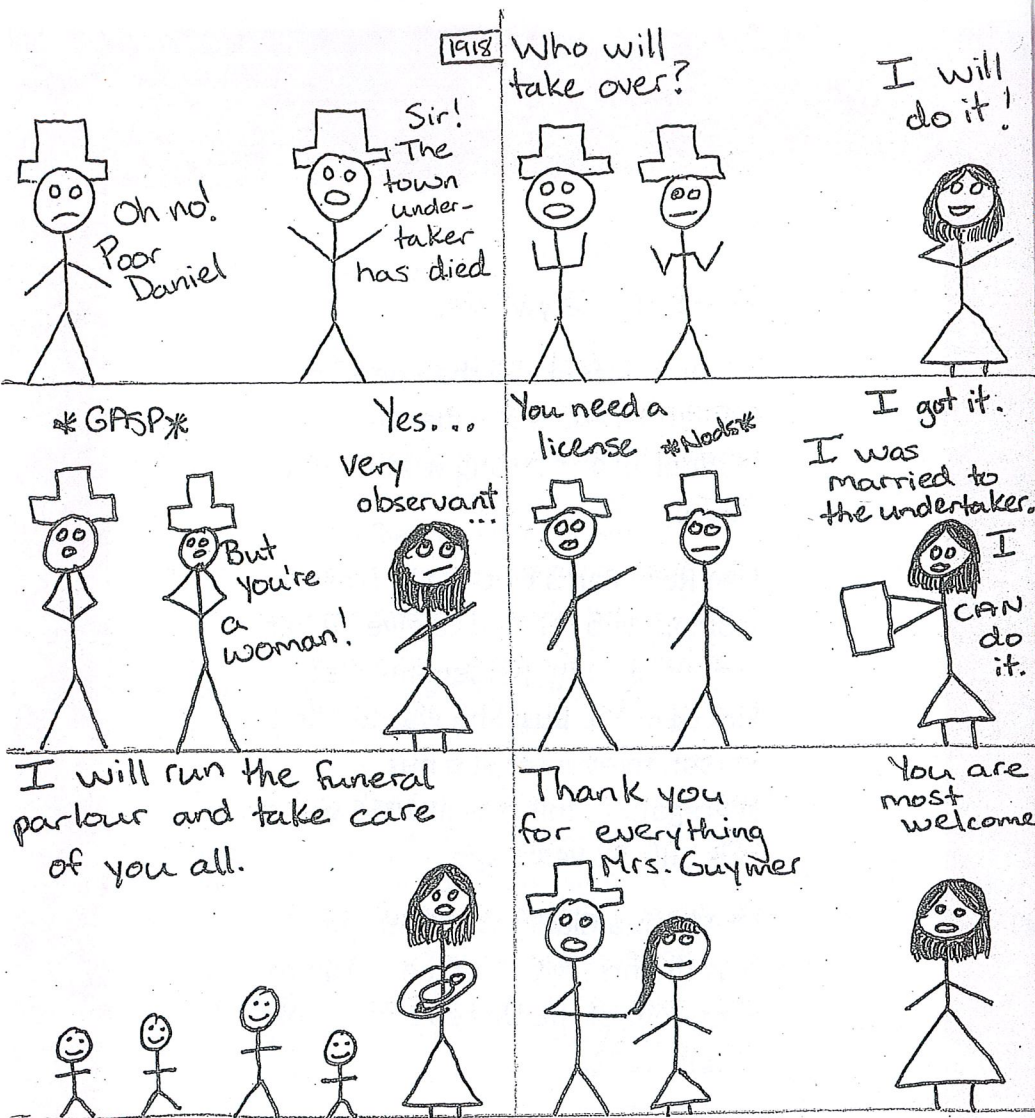
Dear Girls Everywhere,

Violet Guymer was the first female licensed funeral director in Canada.

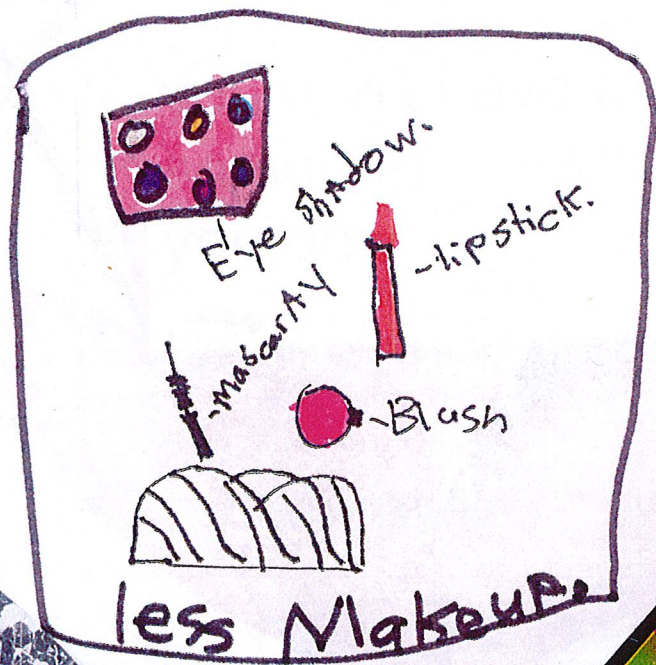
